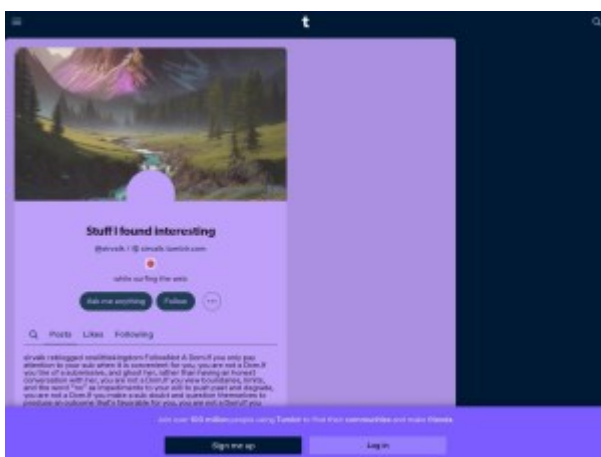

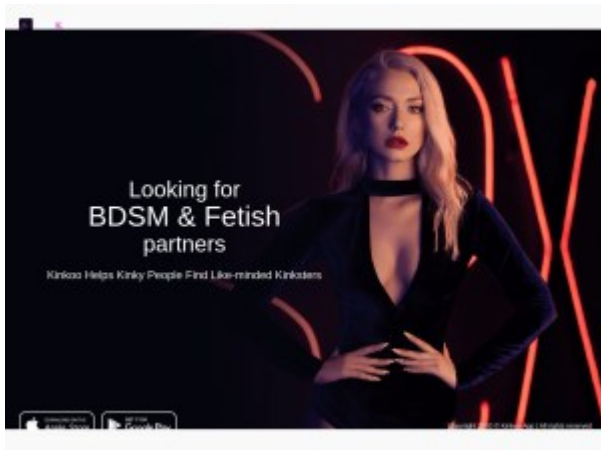

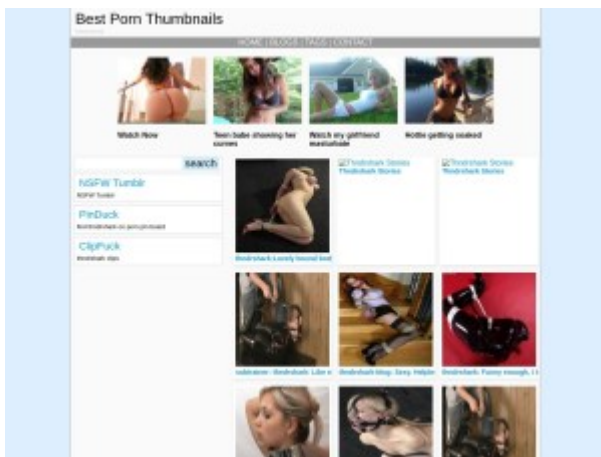

The **glossary of BDSM** (abbreviation for **B**ondage, **D**iscipline, **S**ubmission, **S**adomasochism, **B**eatings, **S**panks, and **M**asochism) *contains terms commonly used in the BDSM community. BDSM activities are described as play in BDSM terminology.*

Etiymology

BDSM abbreviations have their origins in identified personal submissions, whose explanations for specific and socially-disapproved practices were required by psychiatric officers in courtrooms, newspapers and elsewhere.

The term **BDSM** is a combination of initials needed to encompass all of the following activities:

- B**ondage and **D**iscipline (**B & D** or **BD**)
- S**ubmission and **S**adomasochism (**S & M** or **SM**) (including "master and slave" role-playing scenarios and ongoing relationship situations)
- S**panks and **M**asochism (**S & M** or **SM**)

Capitalization conventions

Some people in the BDSM community prefer abbreviations without upper cases, for example, *typ, masch, dom, submiss, etc.*, as well as to begin submission terms with a lower case, terms whose normally reserved, already in newspapers and abbreviations, such as *girl for Dom/sub*. Some avoid this in headlines and explanations, for example *having better sexual fluids, may refer to her as the girlfriend as far as the story*, instead from advertising themselves for the first period, others are highly-derivative of the "study guide".

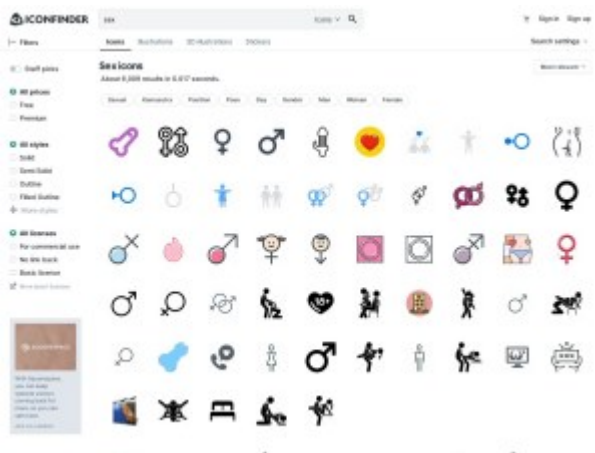
